#### **Overall FY 2015 AIP Funding**


- o NPE \$ 9.28 M\*



    - 16 Scheduled Service
    - Inspected Annually
    - FAA contract to collect data



- 548 Private Airports/Heliports
  - 100+ Hospitals / Medical Centers
  - Inspected every 5 years




#### **MET Towers Structures**



#### **Aviation Planning Section Functions**

OVERSEE AIRPORT PLANNING



- REVIEW PLANNING STUDIES
- ENSURE THAT FUNDED AIRPORT PROJECTS ARE JUSTIFIED AND FEASIBLE
- DEVELOP 4 YEAR PROGRAM FUNDING PLAN
- ADDRESS SPECIAL AND UNIQUE ISSUES





#### **Aviation Grant Programs**

#### **STATE BLOCK GRANT:** \$10 - \$15 million annually

- Administration of FAA Airport Improvement Program Funds
- Airports must be designated by the FAA for eligibility.
- Focus is on national priorities: safety, standards and airfield infrastructure preservation;
- 90% funding
- Documented justification for runway extensions.

#### **AVIATION DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM:** \$6 million annually

- Funding from state Jet Fuel tax.
- Public-use aviation facilities in PA are eligible.
- Relied upon by FAA\SBG airports for ineligible AIP projects and state match
- Non-FAA\SBG airports for all projects; typically 75% state funding for non-match projects.



#### **Aviation Grant Program Differences**

#### **CAPITAL BUDGET:** \$10 million annually

- Limited to public-owned airports
- Eligibility requires a line item and 12-year plan project
- Typically 50% state funding;
- Mostly used for economic development type projects.

#### MULTIMODAL AVIATION

- Available to all public-use airports;
- Typically 70% state funding;
- Mostly used for economic development type projects.

#### **Five Regions**

Regional Engineers/Project Managers, are responsible for the management of all airport development projects including:

- → providing technical guidance to airports through all stages of project development
- → reviewing project documentation for adherence to requirements, accuracy and completion
